Letter From The Pastor

November 2024

I am writing this 6 days before Election Day. We probably won't know final results in many of the races for at least a week. Anxiety levels are rising in the country, the congregation and myself. It doesn't matter which candidate/party one supports, there is enough fear and concern to go around for all sides.

Much of that anxiety surrounds what will happen if "the other candidate" is elected. It doesn't make a difference which is the "other candidate" to you or your loved ones. There is palpable fear out there. And that fear can take over your thoughts, then your emotions, and finally lead to reacting instead of responding. Reacting in anger, with insults, or reacting by withdrawing or pretending none of this matters.

I get it. For whoever is elected President and in other races, there will be those who feel disenfranchised, who feel ignored and dismissed, and/or are scared of "what will happen to this country". Some might feel betrayed by close relatives and friends who voted for the "other" candidate. Others might gloat for backing the winning side. Already friendships have ended, and family relations strained because of one person's support of the "wrong" candidate.

I have my own opinion on who to vote for and why. But so do you. And we may not agree. Yet we are called to love each other as we would love ourselves. Easier said than done. At times it seems candidates, media and more are intentionally ramping up the fear of violent reactions if one side or the other is elected so that such reactions do happen. Loving someone doesn't mean agreeing with them or refraining from discussing differences. It means staying away from dehumanizing others as a group, demonizing all who support the "other" candidate, or immediately assigning negative motives to their choices.

In a time like this, I return to the idea of "Punk Gospel" or as Congressperson John Lewis called it "Good Trouble". Punk Gospel means that God promises us that even if we don't see it, God is in the process of bringing the universe to a good end. A joyful end. A just end. An end that reconciles us with God and with each other as the reign of God becomes fully present.

That doesn't mean we are off the hook. For second, it means we do the right thing because it is the right thing, even if the cause seems or is hopeless. Especially if we don't gain personal benefits from it, as well as when we might lose something. Jesus spoke against those who would victimize and use the vulnerable, the outcast, and those others in society considered discardable. Who healed and fed and taught and prayed. Who did the right thing because it was right, even though it resulted in his execution on the cross. Jesus displayed Punk Gospel hope. He did not know for sure that God would raise him to new life. Still Jesus did the right thing because it was right, and trusted the God would do the same.

It may get worse before it gets better- I hope not. No matter what happens, we will be okay. Remember, we are held by a God who loves us...and also holds the person who voted for the "wrong" candidate. Who is even now bringing about wonders and good in ways we cannot see. Who longs for us to live in ways that bring reconciliation through just actions and builds a diverse community – even among supporters of different candidates. Or maybe especially between?

I hope you prayerfully consider your vote, and vote in a way that reflects your relationship with God through Jesus. No matter if you end up on the winning or losing side, I pray that you, that we can remember that there is a reason we can strive to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. It's because we are striving to love God with all our heart, soul, strength and mind. As Jesus did.

God loves you and holds you even now – no matter who you vote for, no matter who wins. And for that reason, we hope, even in moments where all evidence is to the contrary, that what is good, what is right will prevail, because God will not rest until that happens.


Sunday, November 3, 2024

Church Parking Lot

Finally please make sure that there is sufficient space when cars are parked on both sides of the road for Emergency vehicles to get through if they are responding to a call on the street.


